When the coronavirus crisis first hit back in March, Atlanta Dream Center immediately raced to the frontlines and adapted our programming in order to directly respond to the new and unique needs that arose within the communities we serve. From March 16th to June 13th, the Atlanta Dream Center team:

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The goal of Atlanta Dream Center's Anti-Sex Trafficking Department, called **OUT OF DARKNESS**, is to provide holistic, individualized and trauma-informed care to adult victims of commercial sexual exploitation through a seamless continuum of services including outreach, jail mentorship, 24-hour hotline, safe home services and long-term program placement.

Out of Darkness is poised to respond to crisis situations, efficiently coordinate the care needed for stabilization and make connections to long-term care on behalf of victims.

COLUMBUS, OHIO

With a team of 7 full-time staff and 145 volunteers serving throughout 2020, our Out of Darkness chapter in Columbus, Ohio performed **38 rescues**, opened the doors to their **new 4-bed safe home** and launched their strip club outreach.

MIDDLE GEORGIA

Our Out of Darkness chapter in Middle Georgia led the way in adapting our jail mentorship programming to a penpal initiative during the pandemic, **sending 467 letters** to women in jail who have experienced sex trafficking/exploitation. The team also continued their transition home fundraising — **raising over \$80,000**.

Atlanta Dream Center's Homelessness Department is not a homeless shelter. Instead, the goal is to tangibly move individuals experiencing homelessness from vulnerability to stability by connecting them to critical community resources that restore personal dignity.

We address homelessness through weekly outreaches, support lines, case management services, long-term program placement and homeward bound assistance.




